

Don't Be A Litterbug!

1. Set an example by not littering.
2. Keep a litterbag in your car.
3. Keep your yard clean and free of things that can blow into the street and become litter.
4. When you visit a park or take a drive, remember to take out what you bring in. Keep trash and recyclables in a bag until you can put them in a public litter basket or at home in your trashcan.
5. Talk to your family and friends about recycling to reduce the amount of litter you throw away.
6. Make sure you close the lid on your trashcan after depositing your trash.
7. Do not overfill trashcans. Exposed garbage will likely result in litter in the street or your neighbors' yard.
8. Remove circulars, newspapers or anything laying in yard or driveway promptly before they are blown into the neighborhood as litter.



You can report a litterer:

Get directly involved in making Shively and Louisville a more litter-free community through the Report-A-Litterer program! It's aimed at motorists who throw fast-food wrappers, cigarette butts, soda bottles or any type of litter out their car window.

Call Metro Call 311 or 574-5000 or you can report online <https://louisvilleky.gov/government/metrocalls-311/services/report-litterer>. You must provide your name, email, vehicle license plate number, location, type of litter.

What happens after you submit this form or call in complaint?

After a litterer is reported, the license plate number is verified (including a description of the vehicle) through the County Clerk's Office. The owner of the vehicle will receive a letter saying that someone reported seeing litter being thrown from their vehicle and reminding the owner that littering is punishable by a fine of up to \$500 and/or up to a year in jail. An automobile litter bag also will accompany each letter.

Changing a societal norm like littering begins with each of us. Each person must accept responsibility for their actions and influence the actions of others around them at home, at school, in your place of business and in the community at large. By modeling proper trash and waste disposal, you will cause others to consider changing their behaviors and embodying appropriate actions too.

Code Enforcement Corner

PARKING ON UNPAVED RESIDENTIAL AREAS



72.42 PARKING PROHIBITION.

It shall be unlawful and a violation of this subchapter for any person, corporation, firm or other entity to park or leave standing any automobile, truck, boat, motor home, trailer or other vehicle on the unpaved portion of a residential lot or yard. Gravel driveways and parking pads existing at the time of passage of this ordinance are herewith excepted from the prohibition herein. (Ord. 1-2009, passed 6-8-09)

October is Fire Safety Month

Fire Prevention Week commemorates the Great Chicago Fire, October 8-10, 1871, a fire that killed more than 250 people, left 100,000 homeless and destroyed more than 17,000 buildings. The tragedy inspired reform across the United States, spurring new fire safety codes and public awareness campaigns. Each October, the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) serves as the official sponsor of a nationwide fire prevention campaign to highlight the importance of fire safety education. This year the theme focuses on a very important activity of testing your smoke alarms every month!

Smoke Alarm Basics

- Install smoke alarms in every bedroom, outside each sleeping area and on every level of the home including the basement.
- Interconnect all smoke alarms throughout the home for the best protection. This allows all the alarms to sound when one goes off.
- Test alarms at least once a month by pushing the test button.
- Replace smoke alarms when they are 10 years old or if they do not respond properly when tested.
- An ionization smoke alarm is generally more responsive to flaming fires and a photoelectric smoke alarm is generally more responsive to smoldering fires. Both types of detection alarms or combination photoelectric/ionization alarms, also known as dual-sensor alarms, should be installed in the home.
- Almost two-thirds of home fire deaths happen from fires in homes with no smoke alarms or no working smoke alarms.
- When smoke alarms don't work, it is usually because batteries are missing, disconnected or dead. Remember, working smoke alarms save lives. Test yours every month. For more information on Fire Prevention Week or any other Fire Prevention tips, please visit nfpa.org.

PROPERTY TAX BILLS 2015

We enjoy tax season because it brings many friendly faces into City Hall. The tax payment deadline is September 30th. There is a 10% penalty that will apply on Oct 1st, and each month you are late additional interest is added to the original amount. You can pay in person at Shively City Hall, Monday – Friday, 8 am – 4:30 pm, or we can accept payment with a credit card by phone, 449-5000. If you mail your payment we do accept postmark dates. All delinquent taxes will be subject to a lien, adding an additional \$176.00 to the amount of your taxes.
